The Mobile Community

Africa's mobile revolution



Mobile phone ownership in Africa has **exploded**, and is fast replacing other forms of communication. Until recently, most mobile users were City **dwellers**, but this has changed as network coverage has spread to rural areas. Mobile phones have now become the main way for people to share information in places with no landlines.

This mobile technology has already started to transform different areas of life, from business and banking and agriculture to politics. Big and small businesses alike **rely on** mobiles to respond to customers and manage stock or deliveries.

Text messages are increasingly used to transfer money and pay bills. In rural areas, farmers can receive advice, weather **forecasts** and market prices without travelling into town, while social networks like *Facebook* have played a key role in recent political **uprisings**.

Cheap Chinese handsets have made it possible for more people to own a mobile and teenagers are the group which has benefited most from the drop in prices. The mobile phone has already become an important part of youth culture.
