## Terrorism is the Greatest Challenge to the World Peace.

Today, we are facing a disease that is threatening the entire world. No country is immune from the threat of terrorism, whose enemy is humanity, regardless of religion, gender, age and nationality. The war on terrorism concerns all of us.

In the past few decades, the world has witnessed events and conflicts and their consequences that have made an increasing number of young people more susceptible to fall into the darkness of extremism and the trap of deceitful people. Swift measures should be taken to stop helping the fires of terrorism burn with the blood of our youth, who are the primary target of recruitment, both voluntary and forced, by armies of extremist and terrorist groups.
