### **A Model in the Making<sup>1</sup>**

Outwardly, she looks very shy. With her small frame, she looks delicate and vulnerable. But Chidima Theresa Okoro is not.

The 16 year-old girl is a Secondary Standard 3 (SS3) student of the Government Girls Secondary School in Port Harcourt. Even as a teenager, she is very conscious of herself and her environment and will not step out of the house unless well clad. According to her father, Mr Ambrose Okoro, Chidima started showing interest in modelling when she was seven. A fashion designer, Okoro said his daughter could sew simple but stylish clothes out of the pieces from the shop.

“It is hereditary. Right from when I started having children, I knew that one of them would go into modelling. She is actually taking after me. That is why I have supported her.

I am in the fashion business, so it is not surprising that one of my daughters decided to do what I do for a living. I started trading in *Okrika* second hand clothes<sup>2</sup> before I went into sewing. I started by loosening the fairly used clothes and making new designs from them. I would add one or two things to the design that came with the clothes and would sell it at a higher price. I never had any training in fashion designing, but I have a shop in Port Harcourt where we prepare and sell fabrics and materials.”

Chidima said she had always loved being a model. “I love what models do and how they carry themselves. I also love fashion. I see myself modelling clothes, going into beauty pageant and even social work,” she said with an air of confidence.

Asked whether it would not be absurd for her to think of becoming a model at age 16, when she should be thinking of going to the university, Chidima grimaced and retorted, “Bisi is my role model. She is an international model. I read about her in a fashion magazine which one of my aunties brought home. The magazine had it that Bisi started her modelling career at 15 years. I am even older than that. So what is the problem?”
